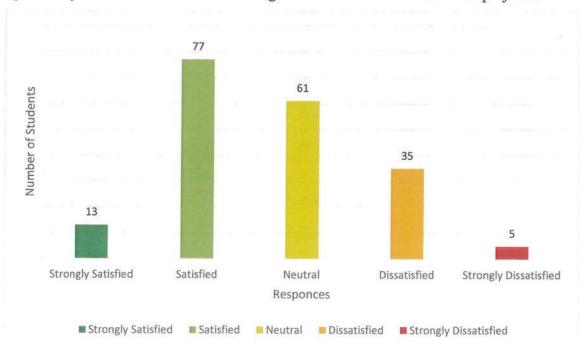

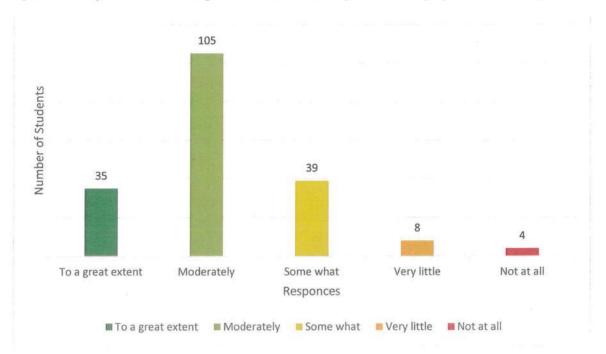

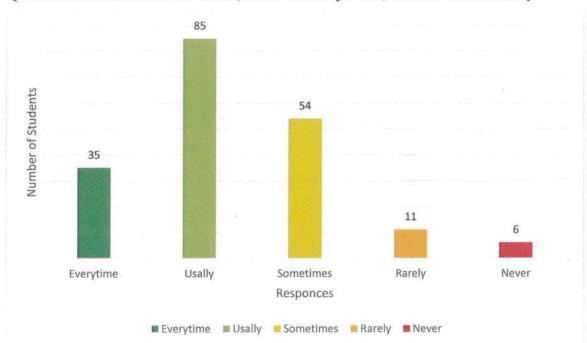
Que.-Are you satisfied with the duration given for skill-based courses and projects?



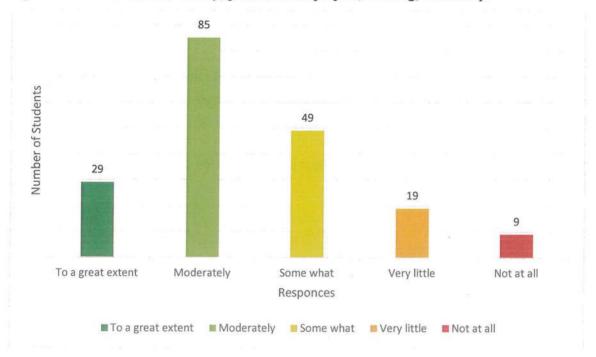

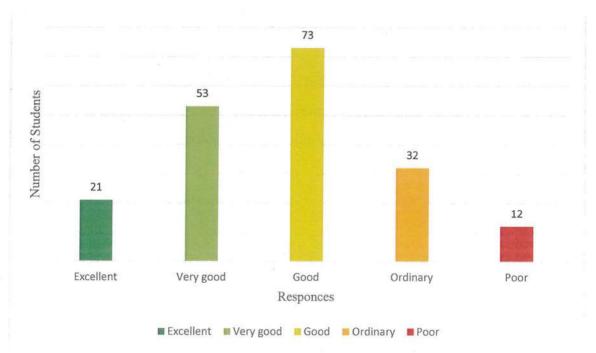

- According to 63% Students sufficient reference books, based on the syllabus, available in the library.

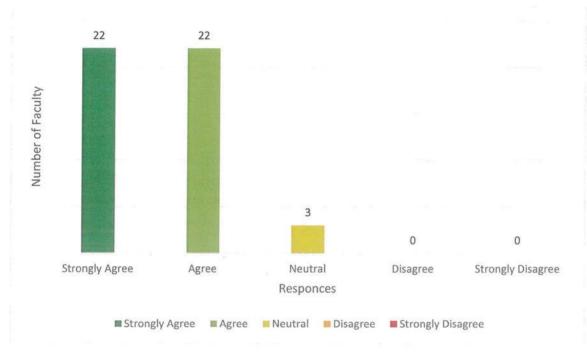
Suggestions from Students on curriculum:

- The courses need to be better placed in the timetable taking into consideration the applying dates for grad projects. courses with heavy importance should be placed not at the end, but the beginning of the semester so that the projects can be included in our portfolios.
- College curriculum should be based on what's trending. Like in product design, AR/VR
 is trending. UI/UX is also demanding, so more courses on UI/UX could follow.
- Design some course, which is relevant to modern day requirements for jobs in today's industry.

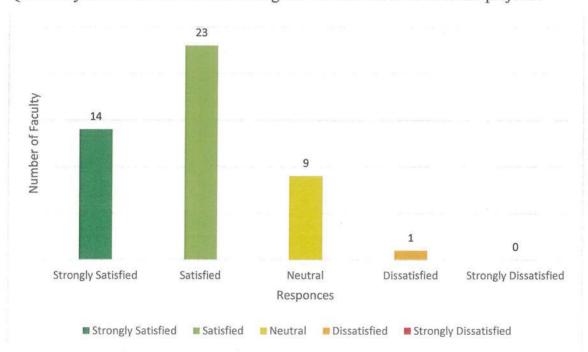

Suggestions from Faculty on curriculum:

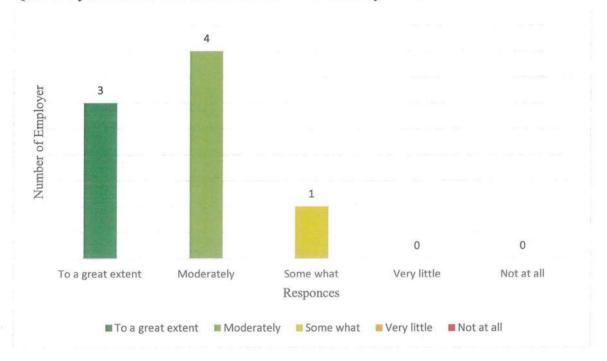
- In the Film and Video Design department, students make films as part of their curriculum, since film making is dependent on technology, it has to be regularly upgraded and updated. Also, some good films need infrastructure for promotion.
- For every 1.5 or 2 years, please revise the curriculum / Syllabus.

- If we want to follow an international standard, the faculty have to be given a space to meet across all disciplines not only design and this could be a quarterly affair.
- Need a better infrastructure towards centre of excellences to facilitate faculty research.

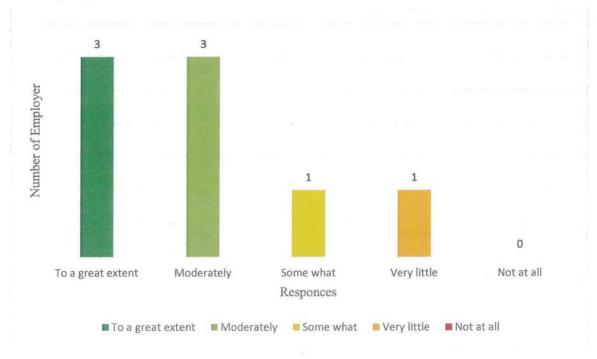

 Consumer (B) Technology (C) Business/ Market. All design students and schools provide
 good inputs in Consumer and Technology aspects while missing out on the Business
 needs.

- Soft skills are very important, what and the way we present need to be taught by professionals.
- The institute should emphasise to their students that professional work ethic is very important in a work place. This can be done through counselling and workshops.
- Frequent engagement with industries can collaborate with industries for classroom projects, electives to choose based on student's interest.
- We feel the Curriculum covers most of the requirements we expect from a design team.
 The only thing lacking is the real time speed of working which can only be achieved in a real time job.

Conclusion:

- 87% Employer feel that the curriculum relevant to the industry needs.
- 75% Employer feel the Institute have done justice in developing skills required for the industry.
- 87% Employer find the fundamental and practical knowledge of the student is good.
- 87% Employer find the soft skills like communication skills, articulation skills, attitude and behaviour of the student is good.

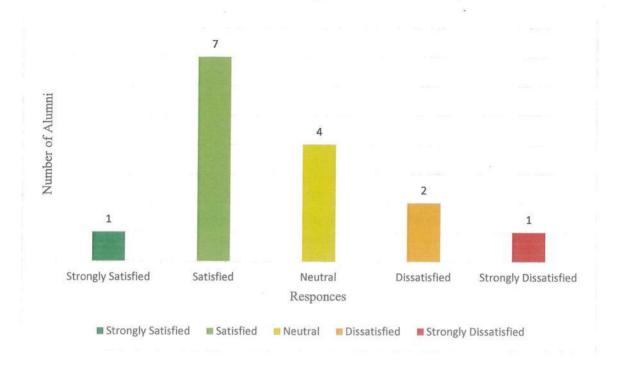
Suggestions from Employer on curriculum:

- For UG Foundation needs to be for 2 years and specialization for 2 years, similarly for PG 1 year foundation and 1 year specialization, students then become wholesome designers.
- The college can include a soft skills training program to equip students with soft skills and encourage them to develop their work ethic, professionalism in the work done. In our observation we found this aspect missing in this batch.

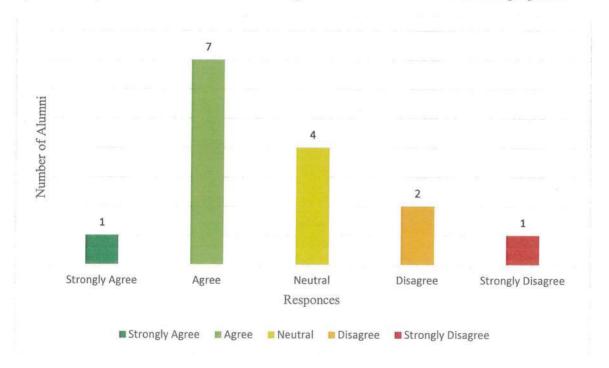

Total number of feedbacks obtained on Curriculum from Alumni- 15

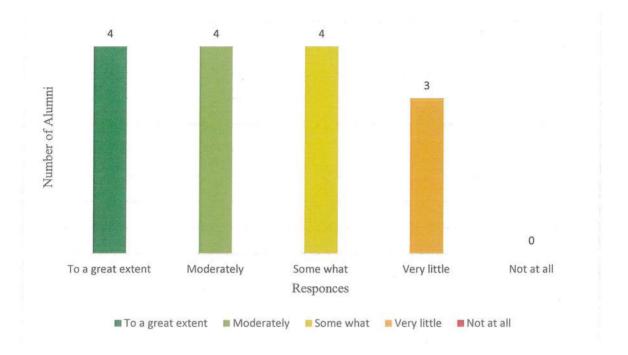

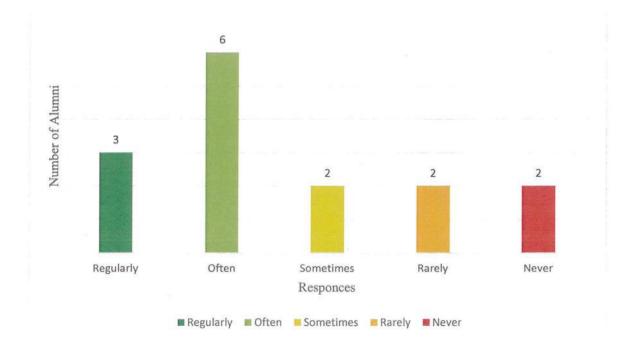
Que.- Were you satisfied with the duration given for skill-based courses and projects?



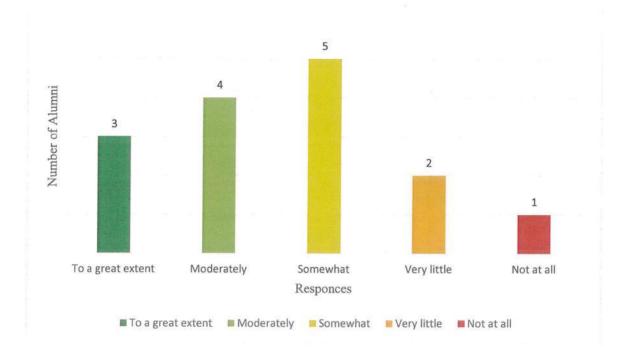

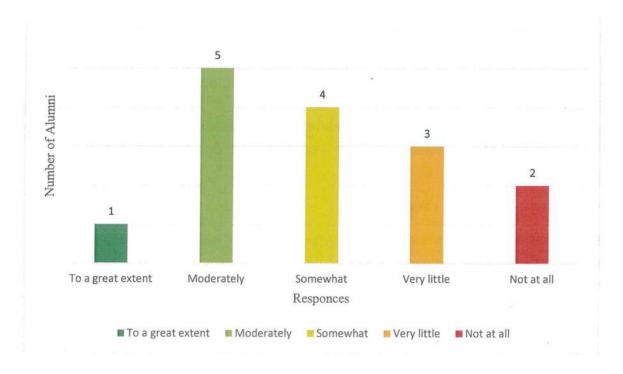

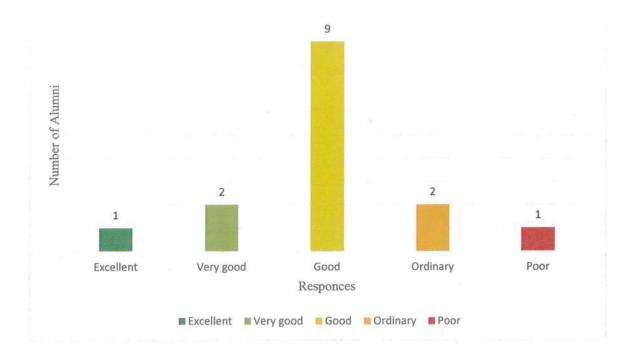

Feedback from Alumni on curriculum:

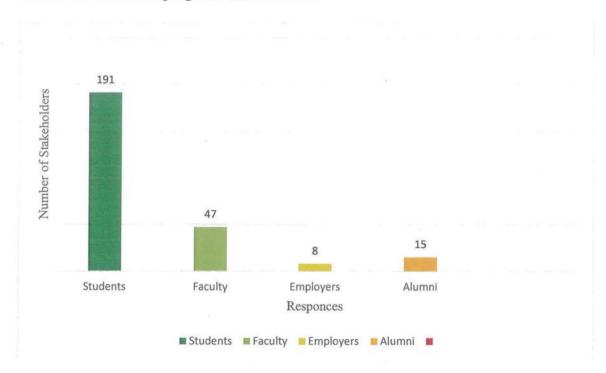
- Learnt the relevant skills to sustain in the industry and have learnt a lot from my faculties in terms of conceptual design.

Suggestions from Alumni on curriculum:

- Students should be trained to give the best portfolio; they should be trained on giving interviews.
- A little restructuring of course (transportation design) can help them understand properly, where they want to be in the industry.
- More frequent communication with industry people. More exposure of leading studios and agencies. Have more industry visits, teach design in terms of a system rather than a specific cog in the system.
